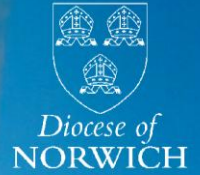

How do we enable the people of Christ to fulfil their part in God's mission; teaching, baptising and nurturing believers?

Give details of current and intended mission activities

What are the good things we are already doing?

Service every week with a variety of services, mixture of formal and informal formats, traditional and modern services caters for differing worship preferences

Two Eucharist services each month led in different ways by Rosie and Canon Jack McGinley. Members of congregation lead intercessions

Church has a homely, holy, peaceful atmosphere – church is open on Sundays in summer

Small central active group with a large fringe group who support the church

Lent and Advent Breakfasts bring together people for discussion and study

Pastoral Ministry Team set up– The team has helped to arrange some special services and been given some training

What else is God wanting for us?

Widen and increase knowledge of the Bible

Promotion of the Pastoral Ministry Team to ensure all parish is aware of their work

Review size of group meetings and discussions to remain parish focused

What can we do this year?

Meet to discuss and study Bible– e.g. Lent Breakfasts held on Fridays

Ensure rest of congregation knows what Pastoral Ministry Team is planning/doing .

Plan some services as necessary during Interregnum e.g. Remembering the departed service

Support isolated and elderly on regular basis

Support the bereaved and organise Remembrance Service (Pastoral Ministry Team)

Organising Toddlers group with some Christian links

Writing and producing Free for all (Jill Day)

Support Beccles Children's' home twice a year (Harvest and Christmas) – increased contact in recent years with inviting children from the home to special services and social events

Keep the church and churchyard in good repair

Open up the church to the community – open days and make it available for PC meetings – make best use of the new facilities

What else is God wanting for us?

Increased awareness of needy in the parish and beyond parish boundaries- locally, nationally and internationally

Develop awareness of church activities across parish

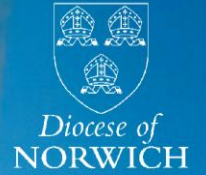
Ease obstacles for people attending church

- Improve experience when visitors come into church – e.g. make candles available, use new notice boards for displays etc
- Open up church more, especially at time of Archaeological dig on Roman Town in August to welcome visitors and Open Churches Week and to support Roam Town Tours by Archaeological Trust

What can we do this year?

- Do more promotion for Mothering Sunday Service to encourage families to come
- Hold Family Service every month and ensure it is family-orientated
- Continue to follow up baptisms with cards on anniversary etc
- Provide facility for prayer requests to be left when church is closed
- Improve links with Parish Council- invite them to meet in church and PCC member to attend meetings
- Songs of Praise service to be held in August
- Order new furniture and carpet fro Children’s area
